

Millage funding helped with improvements at Veterans Memorial Outdoor Pool? The installation of a new pool liner and new pool pump/filtration system.





Capital projects at recreation facilities include major renovations to protect and preserve infrastructure, to improve customer experience by replacing aging amenities and to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act? Projects completed during this millage cycle include Gallup Park which now has a new barrier-free restroom and barrier-free kayak docks and fishing dock.

Each year the millage generates approximately \$6,000,000 in revenue? This revenue funds maintenance needs across the parks, capital projects, the Natural Area Preservation program, park forestry and the GIVE 365 volunteer program.

GIVE 365 Volunteer and Outreach initiatives funded by the millage include the Adopt-A-Park program, Huron River clean-ups, Love-a-Park days, special event staffing and playground care of the more than 80 located in the Ann Arbor parks system?





Millage funding helped with the following improvements at the Ann Arbor Farmers Market? Energy efficient LED lights were installed, gutter downspouts replaced, roof framework repaired, steel column bases repaired, and new entry doors.





The millage funds initiatives and projects in city wide parks? Larger regional parks generally contain game courts, athletic fields and picnic shelters, play areas, roads and parking lots, and restrooms. Capital improvements involve replacement and renovation of these park amenities as they age over time. The Ann Arbor Skatepark was constructed, leveraging millage funds, grant sources, and private contributions.





NAP is entirely funded through the millage? NAP's mission is to protect and restore Ann Arbor's natural areas, and to foster an environmental ethic among its citizens. NAP staff and volunteers do this by conducting a wide range of ecological stewardship activities to restore the native plant and animal communities throughout the Ann Arbor parks systems.





Between 60 percent and 80 percent of the annual millage funds support city park maintenance activities? Park maintenance activities include forestry and horticulture, natural area preservation, park operations, park equipment repairs, park security, and recreation facility maintenance.





Millage funding helped with improvements at Buhr Park Outdoor Pool? New locker room doors, ADA door openers and handicap chair pool lift, new pool liner and pool pump.

Neighborhood parks benefit from millage funding? Most neighborhood parks include a play structure, pathways, park furniture and landscaping, and generally serve residents who live within ¼ mile from the park. Recent improvements were made at Arbor Oaks, Bader, Beckley, Burr Oak, Cranbrook, Esch, Placid Way, Scheffler, South University and Winewood Thaler.
