1. Kathy Griswold - Resolution to Authorize a Professional Services Agreement with Sam Schwartz Consultants, LLC for a Comprehensive Transportation Plan Update (CA-8)

Kathy Griswold, 3565 Foxhunt Drive, Second Ward Council candidate, spoke in opposition to CA-8, and urged Council to stop hiring additional consultants.
