General instructions for preparation of an Annexation Petition by city council resolution, which consists of the following parts and forms:

Part I Map: Shall be labeled and prepared pursuant to State Boundary Commission General Rule 37; **attach sheets labeled "PART I"** [R123.37].

Part II Petition Certification: Requests that the State Boundary Commission annex the area described in Part III description to the adjacent City; **attach sheets labeled "PART II"** [MCL 117.6; MCL 117.7 and MCL117.9(7)(a)].

Part III Legal Description: Shall be labeled and prepared pursuant to State Boundary Commission General Rule 37; **attach sheets labeled "PART III"** [R123.37].

Part IV Resolution: Attach a copy of the resolution passed by the City Council requesting the annexation of the property shown on the "Part I" map and described in the "Part III" description certified by the City Clerk [R123.37(10)].

Part V Reason for Request: Petitioner(s) reason(s) for the annexation request and statement indicating that the annexation meets the conditions pursuant to Section 9 of The Home Rule City Act, 1909 PA 279 [MCL117.9(7)(a)]; **attach sheets labeled "PART V"** [R123.37].

Part VI: This part is not required on this type of petition.

Part VII Map: Shall contain a map showing the relationship of the area proposed for annexation to the balance of the involved and adjacent units of government; attach sheets; attach sheets labeled "PART VII" [R123.37].

Provide contact information of petitioner and involved local units of government; **attach sheets** [R123.32(1)].




The township parcel(s) proposed to be annexed into the City of Ann Arbor are surrounded by land within City of Ann Arbor's ultimate jurisdiction. The City of Ann Arbor is initiating annexation of township parcels for a number of reasons: a) Increase efficiency of municipal services. Currently, emergency responders from both the City and Township provide services within the City's ultimate boundary (e.g. sometimes City police respond to service calls from township island properties). Additionally, the City provides solid waste services to City parcels while private haulers provide solid waste services to township parcels in the same neighborhood. Voting is also inefficient. Both the Township and the City provide voting precincts for neighborhoods that include township islands. Four building departments provide services to properties within the City's ultimate service area. b) Annexation will result in a more equitable provision of public

services. Currently, township island residents receive a number of City services without paying for them such as road resurfacing and reconstruction, street lighting, stormwater management, and City parks; and c) Annexing the properties will allow the City to more effectively plan and implement infrastructure improvements. In 1979, The City of Ann Arbor entered into agreements with Scio Township and Pittsfield Township which defined the City's ultimate service area. In 1994, the City of Ann Arbor and the Ann Arbor Township entered into an annexation agreement that defined the City's ultimate boundary. The agreement indicated that after December 31, 2007, the Township would no longer contest City initiated annexations. This annexation application is consistent with these agreements. The proposed annexations meet the conditions pursuant to Section 9 of The Home Rule City Act, 1909 PA 279. This petition for annexation includes fewer than 100 persons.

The City of Ann Arbor initiated annexation of this property by City Council resolution on October 1, 2018. The necessary conditions as identified by the State Boundary Commission have been met.
