- Initial reasons still apply:Student population
 - Downtown congestion
 - Supportive Infrastructure
 - ➤ Limited parking
 - ➢ Bus to bike connections





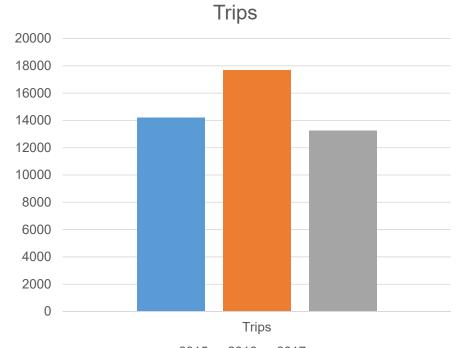
Initial Project Launch

- ≽\$600,000 federal capital investment
- ➤3 year operational funding agreement
- 2014 Partial Season only
 6 stations, 45 bikes
 - ≻ 676 trips from 248 users

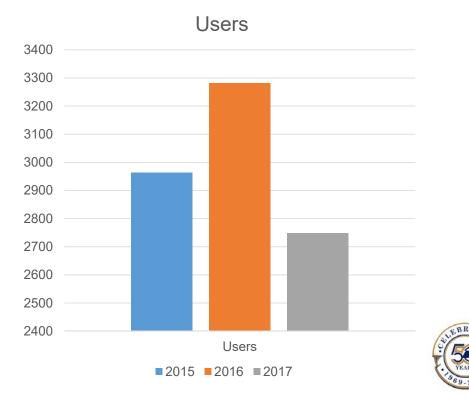




Operations 2015 - 2017



■2015 ■2016 ■2017

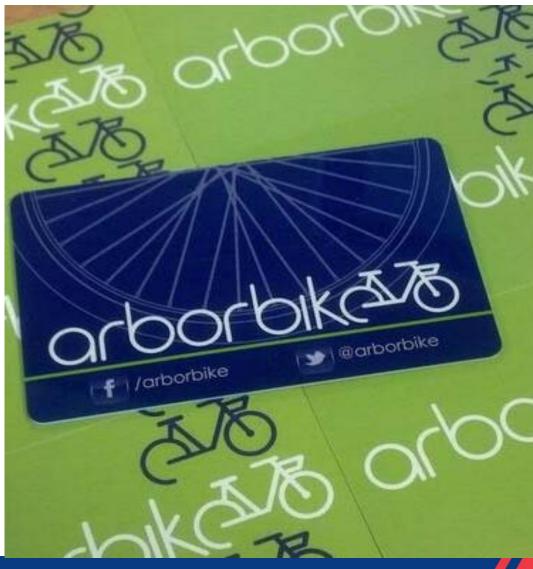




Program shifts

- Operational funding expires (2017 extension)
- Lack of on-going community sponsorship

Shift Transit Introduction

- Headquartered in Chicago, Illinois
- 110 Employees
- Bike share operations in Detroit, Toronto, Tucson, and Chattanooga
- Carshare operations in Chicago (400 cars)
- Shift Transit Customers have taken over 1.95 million rides in 2018!



MoGo + Arborbike

- MoGo, Detroit's Bike Share, operated by Shift Transit
 - 44 stations and 430 bikes
 - Over 50,000 rides in 2018
 - Boasting 2800 members.
- We plan to create synergies between the program (potential in membership, operations, and marketing)
- MoGo Executive Director, Lisa Nuszkowski, is very open to exploring integrating both programs
- MoGo set to expand regionally next Spring with 30 additional stations



Industry Overview

- Dock-based bike share continues to be the standard and norm in North American bike share as 96% of all trips are taken on dock based systems
- Unfortunately, many dockless bike share companies are changing their recent tune:
 - Ofo and Mobike have left the North American market completely
 - Spin no longer offers dockless bike share
 - Lime is focused far more heavily on non-bike shared mobility options
- Dockless bike share not proven reliable from a customer experience perspective (The Seattle Times audited 150 bicycles earlier this year to find only 65% useable).



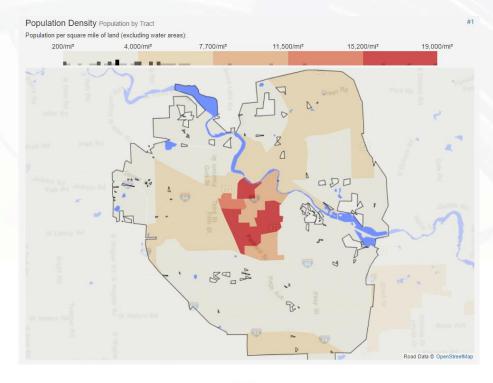
Arborbike: Moving Forward

- Local Executive Staffing:
 - Corporate Director of Operations: Becky Quinn
 - Regional General Manager: Omari Colen
- Proposed early Spring 2019 re-launch
- Proposed year-round operations of all stations
- Full marketing push from Shift team including corporate Director of Marketing Heili Toome and Community Manager Carli Burr
- In-market activations such as Free Ride Days to gather momentum for the program



Future Expansion?

- Arborbike was the first and only public bike-share program in SE Michigan with it's launch, Sept 25, 2014, until Detroit launched, on May 23, 2017. Since inception bike-share awareness has significantly increased.
- Density is key. Ann Arbor is ranked 10th in the Midwest and 23rd in the US for population by density, according to Statistical Atlas/US Census Bureau.
- Arborbike can easily double in size (or more) with focused operations, marketing, sponsorship and community support. We would like to revisit this topic in the fall of 2019.





The Customer Experience

- Shift Transit prides itself on upholding an industry-leading standard of operational success which is directly correlated into the customer experience
 - Rebalancing
 - Bicycles in Service
 - Monthly Bike/Station Audits
 - ▶ Every bike undergoes a thorough 15-point Quality Control Inspection at least once a month.
 - Reporting
 - Monthly reports generated to provide overall system health and ridership statistics.



B-Cycle Relationship

- Shift Transit executives have worked with multiple bicycle and software vendors in the past with great success
- Senior Technology Coordinator- Michael Autullo has excellent technology background working with multi-platforms and will be working with Regional General Manager Omari Colen to relaunch the program from a technology and operations perspective
- We look forward to working with the team at B-Cycle to relaunch the program!
