## Safety Notes

**A2** Be Safe! City Hall Guest Services Desk Launches August 5. On Monday, Aug. 5, the Larcom City Hall Guest Services Desk will open and be staffed by personnel from Liberty Security Group. The intent of this change is to improve safety and security in City Hall and to provide a more welcoming environment for visitors by having staff who can greet and direct them to the appropriate location in City Hall.

Along with the guest services desk opening, the elevators to floors 3-6 will be locked down 24/7, and visitors will need an elevator access card (proxy card) to access those floors. Access to the basement, first floor and second floor will not change. Visitors to City Hall who need to access floors 3-6 will be required to check in at the guest services desk and receive authorization to access upper floors. Issued elevator access cards will only allow access to the intended floor; and visitors will need to display the cards while they are in the building.

## Success Stories

Ann Arbor Initiatives Recognized with American Planning Association Awards. The City of Ann Arbor is pleased to announce that two projects have been recognized by the <u>Michigan Chapter</u> of the American Planning Association for planning excellence. The <u>Treeline-Allen Creek Urban</u> <u>Trail Master Plan</u> has been selected as the winner of the 2019 Transportation Planning award and the city's "Impacting Your City" project as the winner of its 2019 Public Outreach award. Selected by a jury of planning professionals, the awards will be presented at a ceremony on Sept. 25, 2019. The <u>Treeline project</u>, which created a plan to transform the area along Allen Creek for a new nonmotorized transportation path, was a collaborative effort that brought together city staff, community members, elected officials, businesses and local organizations.

## Sustainability & Innovations Corner

Welcome to the newest section of the Administrator's Report: The Sustainability and Innovations Corner. We will be using this section to share notable, high-level updates on things happening throughout the City to advance our sustainability-related goals and objectives.

• <u>Energy Efficiency RFP</u> – the City issued an RFP to identify firms that can do deep energy efficiency audits for 12 city facilities. RFP responses are currently being reviewed and we anticipate bringing a contract to Council for consideration in the coming weeks.

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- <u>Solar RFP</u> The City is currently working on an RFP for solar installations at 13-16 city facilities. We hope to have the RFP released for bidding in the coming weeks. Once responses are received, staff will return to Council with an update and potential contract for consideration.
- <u>Volunteer Solar Installation</u> We are close to finalizing our volunteer solar installation at Fire Station 6. We have finalized all the safety details, done a preliminary energy assessment, sized our solar system, and are in the final phase of selecting our solar panels and our solar installer who will work in partnership with the volunteers to physically install the system. We anticipate coming to council in September with a formal contract to move this exciting project forward! Thanks to Josh MacDonald and Fire Chief Kennedy, as well as community members Wayne Appleyard, Mark Clevey, John Mirsky, and Dave Konkle (and many others) for helping move this initiative forward.
- <u>Environmentally Preferable Purchasing</u> The City is updating its Environmentally Preferable Purchasing Policy to encourage more sustainable practices and souring at city facilities. We plan to include a functional ban on Styrofoam and plastic, as well as the elimination of dozens of toxic chemicals for our cleaning supplies and operations.
- <u>Sustaining Ann Arbor Together</u> The SA2T grant program has reset with \$100,000 available for granting this fiscal year. We've already received two applications, and know of 3 more in the works. We will be reviewing applications in mid-August and making our first funding decisions shortly thereafter. ## WIP (Work in Progress)

**Solid Waste Resources Management Plan (SWRMP) Status.** The initial draft of the Solid Waste Resources Management Plan (SWRMP) has been submitted by the project consultant (APTIM) for review by the staff core team. Following this review by mid-July, the report will be revised and the final draft plan will be distributed to the SWRMP Advisory Committee for their review by early August. With City Council's recent approval of Amendment #1 for the contract with APTIM, an additional fifth meeting will be held with the Advisory Committee in mid-August to discuss the draft plan. The plan will then be presented to the Environmental Commission at their August 22, 2019 meeting for their input and action. The final SWRMP and its recommendations will be included in the Solid Waste topic at the September City Council work session scheduled for September 9, 2019.

**Road Construction Season.** Road construction season in Ann Arbor is underway with much to accomplish in 2019. The City has plans to resurface or restore 12 major streets and 33 local streets, and an additional 40 major and local streets will undergo preventative maintenance. A list of roadways planned for construction this year is available so residents and visitors will know

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what to expect (and where to avoid if possible). Updates are posted on the City's road construction project page. You can also subscribe to updates.

#### Other

August 6 Special Election Tips and Polling Location Information. The Special Election will occur in all Ann Arbor wards on Tuesday, Aug. 6. All city polling places will be open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. For ballot information, visit www.a2gov.org/elections. To locate your ward and/or polling place, go to the Michigan Voter Information web page at www.michigan.gov/vote or contact the city clerk's office at 734.794.6140, cityclerk@a2gov.org or in person on the second floor of Larcom City Hall.

Any gualified Ann Arbor resident not already registered to vote can still register and vote up until 8 p.m. on Election Day. In-person voter registration is available at the city clerk's office. Proof of residency is required during the last 14 days prior to an election.

All absentee ballots must be returned to the city clerk's office by 8 p.m. on Election Day. In-person requests for absentee ballots will be accepted at the city clerk's office until 4 p.m. on Monday, Aug. 5. Voters requesting ballots on Aug. 5 must vote and return the ballot that same day.

Below are important voter tips and ward and precinct polling-location information:

- Don't forget to bring your photo ID to vote. Voters who do not have a valid photo ID will be required to sign an affidavit in order to vote.
- Polling place hours are 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day. Registered voters standing in line by 8 p.m. will be eligible to vote.
  - 4-2 (Mary Street Polling Place, 926 Mary St.) Please note, voters leaving this polling place via Mary Street may be required to reroute due to the construction project on Greene Street between Hoover Avenue and Kipke Drive. An Election Day voter parking sign is located in front of this polling place.
- New permanent polling place location:
  - Due to the addition of new precincts in the city, voters assigned to Precinct 1–9 will be permanently relocated to a new polling place at Logan Elementary School, 2685 Traver Road, along with new Precinct 1–11.
- Temporary Polling Place Relocations for Aug. 6 Special Election:
  - **1–4** Relocated to 2<sup>nd</sup> Baptist Church, 850 Red Oak Drive.
  - 1-1 and 1-12 Relocated to Rackham Graduate School, 915 E. Washington Street, for the remainder of 2018 and 2019.
  - **4–1** Relocated to U-M Coliseum, 721 S. Fifth Ave.
