
Food Rescue in Numbers

Rescued food makes up 41% of all food handled by staff and volunteers

In FY 2019, 6.64 million pounds of food were distributed.

- 16% Food rescue from within the City of Ann Arbor
- 25% Other food rescue
- 26% Other donated foods
- 20% USDA foods
- 12% Purchased food

Food Rescue in Ann Arbor

Rescued food from the City of Ann Arbor makes up 16.4% of all food handled by staff and volunteers or 40% of all rescued food.

Food Rescue Breakdown




Food Rescue by the Pound

The Cost of Food Rescue

Rescued food from within the City of Ann Arbor accounted for 16.4% of all food handled during acquisition and distribution.

The estimated annual department cost for handling Ann Arbor food rescue was \$128,534.
