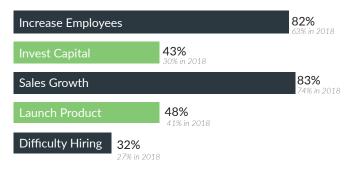

Companies assisted during this semi-annual contract period

July 1, 2019 - December 31, 2019

SPARK acts as project manager for both Ann Arbor and the companies it serves. Our project management efforts can be fairly simple, such as conducting data analysis that a company may use in its business planning, or as complex as full project management for significant company expansions. This would include everything from:

- Connecting them to proper resources
- Working with the site selection community to help determine a location for a project
- Fully managing the tax incentive paperwork and the process it may require
- Creating communication plans
- Traveling to company locations outside of the state
- Making presentations to key public and private decision makers
- Talent recruitment efforts

When companies apply for Local or State incentives they fill out applications that require both job creation and investment estimates. SPARK considers these projects a success after it is publicly announced, or when the proper approval process has taken place for the incentive sought by the company. SPARK's jobs and investments numbers are based on these project announcements provided by the companies. SPARK monitors actual job creation and those results are shown in this report.

SPARK supports a company directly or it supports the consultants the company utilizes during its expansion. Whatever role SPARK might play, we capture jobs and investments for projects that we have played an active role in helping a company make a decision to move forward.

SPARK celebrates all projects that may have an impact on our region. We do not count jobs and investments where SPARK was not directly involved.

Ann Arbor SPARK Metrics - Investment

July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2019

Investments are recorded based on publicly available information of capital expenditures on real property, leasehold improvements, and furniture and fixtures. Companies may make additional capital investments that we are **not aware of**, or they may use alternative methods such as leasing equipment to acquire assets for growth opportunities. Recent changes to property tax law that allow for personal property exemptions make it less likely that a company would record all investment dollars at the time of an expansion or attraction project.

Some growth projects during this time period were based on growth or attraction projects that involved leases, leasehold improvements, and/or the installation of personal property like computers, furniture, etc. This information is not captured in a standard format. These projects did, however, involve the creation of 116 new jobs in the City of Ann Arbor.

Ann Arbor SPARK growth visit program

Ann Arbor SPARK's Business Development team identifies companies for our growth program based on the following criteria:

- 1. Large Employers
- 2. Previous Investments
- 3. All firms from the previous year growth program with indicators of rapid growth (hiring, increased sales)
- 4. Firms with large infusion of capital or grant funding in the previous two years
- 5. Companies that were sold, or that are new to Ann Arbor
- 6. Companies that are having difficulty finding employees
- 7. Business Accelerator companies that have achieved sales or staff levels that graduate them to Business Development companies

Between July and December 2019, SPARK held growth visits with 26 companies in the City of Ann Arbor.

Economic Indicators from Growth Visits 7/1/2019 - 12/31/2019

- 82% of visited companies are projecting they will increase headcount
- 43% of visited companies indicate they will invest new capital beyond maintenance
- 83% of visited companies project new sales growth in the next year
- 48% of visited companies are planning to launch a new product or technology in the next year
- 32% of visited companies have difficulty finding new employees

When SPARK is contacted by the MEDC, consultants, individual firms, external referrals, and/or site selectors regarding attraction prospects and possible location requests we...

- Respond with local area information: Demographics, industry sector information, university graduates, other useful information;
- Respond to site requests by searching for buildings, space, and vacant land based on site requirement, using site databases, broker blasts, and our knowledge of local real estate;
- Set up site visits with listing brokers and accompany company representatives on the site tour;
- Make introductions to local municipality officials to discuss the project and possible tax abatement;
- Work closely with MEDC on state incentives;
- Connect the attraction prospect with university, banks, attorneys, and other contacts to assist with integration into the business community.

Student Discovery Trek - October 2019





The Ann Arbor region's growing tech sector is directly fueled by the immense talent graduating from the University of Michigan. According to reports from the University Career Center and the Engineering Career Resource Center, approximately 30 percent of undergraduates remain in Michigan. In an effort to retain more of this talent post-graduation, Ann Arbor SPARK coordinated with the University of Michigan Center for Entrepreneurship to host Student Discovery Trek — an event designed to connect students and Ann Arbor-based tech companies.

Ann Arbor SPARK welcomed **50 students and 24 companies** at its SPARK Central Innovation Center in October 2019 for a series of speed networking and meet-and-greet sessions. As a result of the Discovery Trek, two of the participating companies were able to fill open internship opportunities.

One of those companies was Duo Security, represented at the event by Deepak Bhaskaran, director of QA. "Duo receives an enormous amount of applications for internship positions and we continuously strive to ensure that our program is accessible and inclusive," said Deepak. "A key part of this effort is engaging with the local community, meeting face-to-face with new candidates, and telling them about Duo and the opportunities we offer. These efforts broaden the channels into our company."

Participating companies also included early stage startups such as Every Two Minutes who hired an intern as a result of the event. "Participating in Discovery Trek was a great opportunity to interact with U-M students majoring in entrepreneurship and learn about their interests," said Erin Rose, CEO and founder. "I was fortunate to meet Gabrielle, who is a sophomore majoring in art and design with a minor in Entrepreneurship. We immediately brought her on as an intern and she is currently working on some marketing and social media projects."

Students also visited Menlo Innovations, Barracuda Networks, and Cahoots.

Tech Homecoming November 2019

The Ann Arbor region is a growing, thriving tech ecosystem and the companies located here are hiring in droves. Ann Arbor SPARK connected job seekers with some of the top companies in the region during Tech Homecoming on November 27 from 4 – 7 p.m. This free, happy-hour style event happens each year the night before Thanksgiving, hoping to attract job seekers returning to Michigan for the holiday.

"Tech Homecoming is a great occasion for job seekers to meet with several employers in a low-pressure setting," says Phil Santer, Ann Arbor SPARK senior vice president. "The participating companies have multiple openings and span the region's top industries, providing a lot of variety and depth for attendees."

Cahoots, one of Ann Arbor's newest co-working spaces hosted this year's event. The participating companies were: Alfa Jango; Atomic Object; DaySmart Software; Duo Security, now part of Cisco; InfoReady Corporation; KLA; PassiveBolt; Pillar, part of Accenture Industry X.O; Saganworks; Shoptelligence; Shopwindow; and SkySpecs.

KLA, a global organization that develops industry-leading equipment and services that enable innovation throughout the electronics industry, announced earlier this year that Ann Arbor would be the site of its second North American headquarters. "We are thrilled to participate in our first Tech Homecoming," said John McLaughlin, KLA senior director and Ann Arbor site leader. "KLA chose Ann Arbor for its ability to attract top talent while offering our employees an exceptional quality of life."

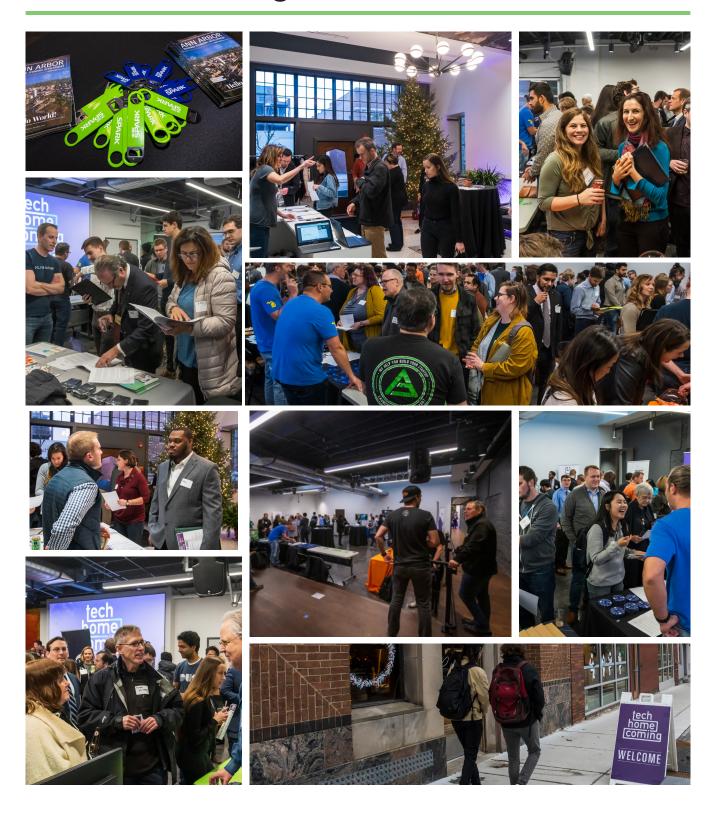

Three Ann Arbor SPARK Clients Selected for SXSW Pitch: KDerq, MySideKick, and Pathware were selected as finalists in the eleventh annual SXSW Pitch® (formerly SXSW Accelerator) taking place on Saturday, March 9 and Sunday, March 10 in Austin. The pitch competition will feature 50 interactive technology companies competing in 10 different categories in front of a live audience and a panel of expert judges. More than 800 companies applied to present at SXSW Pitch 2019, the marquee event of South by Southwest® (SXSW®) Conference & Festivals Entrepreneurship & Startup track, where leading startups from around the world showcase some of the most impressive technological innovations. Ann Arbor SPARK will return to SXSW in 2019, renewing its partnership with Michigan House.

Two Companies Graduate from Ann Arbor SPARK Innovation Centers: Two growing startups, Spellbound and Revalue, recently "graduated" from Ann Arbor SPARK's Central and East Innovation Centers. Both companies outgrew the space available to them in the incubator and have moved to offices. Spellbound is located in downtown Ann Arbor and Revalue chose a location in downtown Ypsilanti.

Atomic Object Expands Ann Arbor Footprint: Atomic Object will extend its tenancy into an additional floor of its office in downtown Ann Arbor today. The renovated third story will serve as a client hosting and event space for the growing company that builds custom software applications for businesses across the country. Founded in Grand Rapids in 2001, Atomic Object established its Ann Arbor presence in 2013 with the acquisition of SRT Solutions. Since then, the employee-owned Certified B Corporation has embedded itself in the Ann Arbor community—building software for more than 30 clients, partnering with local schools and nonprofits, and hosting meetups. Meanwhile, Atomic's Ann Arbor contingent grew to 20 people—mostly software developers and designers. Atomic Object CEO Carl Erickson says the new space is an investment in Ann Arbor and its future.

Ann Arbor SPARK's Annual a2Tech360 Returns with Expanded Programming: Ann Arbor SPARK recently announced expanded a2Tech360 programming this year. a2Tech360 originated last year as an extension of its popular A2 Tech Trek event as a way to deliver broader programming to spotlight the region's innovative people and businesses. a2Tech360 is presented by KLA with support from the Michigan Economic Development Corporation. An Ann Arbor SPARK initiative, a2Tech360 dedicates itself to promoting the ecosystem of the Ann Arbor area of innovation. More than a week of techrelated events, a2Tech360 creates connections between innovators, researchers, investors, businesses, educational institutions, non-profits, job seekers and the general public to generate discussion, ideas and new opportunities.

Ann Arbor SPARK FastTrack Awards Celebrate Impressive, Consistent Business Growth: Ann Arbor SPARK presented its 21st annual FastTrack Awards to 14 Washtenaw County-based companies that have demonstrated fast growth. Several of the 2019 FastTrack Award recipients were multiple year winners. FastTrack Awards are presented to companies with impressive records of growth. Recipients of this year's awards were required to have revenue of at least \$100,000 in 2015, with an annual growth of 20 percent for the following three years. UHY LLP is the 2019 Ann Arbor SPARK FastTrack Awards accounting partner and verified all of the award applications. FastTrack Award winners were recognized on Monday, June 10, during an evening reception at the University of Michigan Golf Course Clubhouse and supported by presenting sponsor Northstar Bank. New for 2019, the FastTrack Award ceremony concluded a2Tech360, the week-long series of events promoting the Ann Arbor area and our ecosystem of innovation.

ProjectFRED: New Client to Join Ann Arbor SPARK Central Innovation Center: ProjectFRED helps buyers and sellers fund deals while automating the management and operation of commercial assets using fractional ownership on the blockchain. It is a real estate marketplace that is changing the way commercial real estate is bought, sold, funded, and managed. With expertise in connecting entrepreneurial technology companies with a wealth of mentoring programs and resources, Ann Arbor SPARK will be helping ProjectFRED achieve its financial objectives and create meaningful connections that will further the company on its journey to success. Up next on the agenda, the ProjectFRED team will be participating in the Entrepreneur Boot Camp that kicks off next month, on October 17.

R2 Space Announces New Headquarters in Ann Arbor: R2 Space, Inc., established in 2018, is an aerospace company dedicated to providing U.S. government and commercial customers with space-based satellite radar intelligence. As a result of current and future growth through new contracts, the company plans to relocate and expand its corporate headquarters in the City of Ann Arbor. Once completed, the space will include an ISO-class 8 clean room, electrical and mechanical test labs and associated specialized test equipment, manufacturing equipment and a satellite operations mission center. The expansion will involve the creation of 30 new jobs and a capital investment of up to \$1,396,000 in Ann Arbor, resulting in a \$250,000 Michigan Business Development Program performance-based grant. In addition to MSF support, Ann Arbor SPARK is prepared to assist the company in finding candidates for the newly created positions. Michigan was chosen over competing sites in Ohio, Texas, Louisiana and Virginia.

IndustryStar Solutions Graduates from Ann Arbor SPARK Central Innovation Center: IndustryStar Solutions, an on-demand supply chain services and software technology startup that reduces the cost, time, and risk of new product launches, recently "graduated" from the Ann Arbor SPARK Central Innovation Center. After years of steady success, the two-time FastTrack Awardee has outgrown the incubator's capacity and has moved to an expanded office space located south of downtown Ann Arbor. IndustryStar Solutions' end-to-end supply chain technology-enabled service offerings, spanning procurement, supplier quality, production control, and logistics required some unique office needs that SPARK aided in identifying locally for the team.

Ann Arbor is Developing a Smart City Strategic Plan: The City of Ann Arbor is in the process of developing a strategic plan as it continues to design and build a holistic and robust infrastructure to support Smart City initiatives. A solid Smart City foundation will enable the city to connect to a variety of systems to the city network and allow for remote monitoring and capture of data that can be used to make intelligent business decisions. Smart lighting, smart water meters, smart parking, autonomous vehicles, traffic monitoring, public safety and environmental monitoring are just some examples where Smart City concepts can be applied to improve our community. The city is currently in the analysis and assessment phase of Smart City planning. Public meetings are scheduled to explain what it means to be a Smart City as well as to gather feedback from the community that will assist in strategy development.

ADI Wins Project Award at F-35 JPO Pitch Day in Washington, D.C.: Applied Dynamics (ADI) is happy to announce that on November 21, 2019 in Washington, D.C., ADI participated in the F-35 JPO Pitch Day competition and was awarded a contract sponsored by the Air Force Research Laboratory (AFRL) and the F-35 Lightning II Joint Program Office to investigate the feasibility of modernizing US Air Force test facilities with industrial real-time Linux servers and the ADEPT Framework.
