The meeting is well attended, she stated, due to the suspension of Police Chief Cox. She stated the Council is expected to receive the report of an independent investigator in the next few days.

### **PUBLIC COMMENT - GENERAL (3 MINUTES EACH)**

Peter Eckstein, resident, spoke about the recent suicides from the City's parking structures. He urged Council to consider permanent fencing solutions to deter future deaths.

Sally Hart Petersen, Ward One, spoke about the Resolution to Conclude the Employment Agreement with the City Administrator. Ms. Petersen expressed her frustration on this decision and urged Council to reconsider.

Julie Roth, resident, spoke in opposition to the Council's vote to terminate the City Administrator, stating it was politically motivated.

Ed Vielmetti, Ward Four, spoke about the termination of the City Administrator and the sections of the separation agreement. He spoke about the non-disparage section of the contract and suggested it be changed to a mutual admiration agreement. He also talked about the non-disclosure agreement.

Kai Petainen, resident, spoke about the agreement to terminate the City Administrator's employment agreement. He expressed concern with staff being terminated due to politics.

Frances Todoro, Vice Chair of ICPOC, shared statements from their recent meeting. The statements were related to the administrative leave of Police Chief Michael Cox and the lack of information and transparency.

Lisa Jackson, Chair of ICPOC, read a statement from their meeting related to the unexpected administrative leave of Police Chief Michael Cox. She stated ICPOC was created to promote trust and transparency and the Commission cannot do its work with this level of secrecy.

Zachary Storey, resident, spoke about the City's affordable housing issue. He also addressed the termination of the City Administrator, expressing his concern and frustration with the vote.

*Tim Petersen, Ward One, spoke against the vote to terminate the City Administrator.* 

Alan Haber, Ward One, stated he came to the meeting to discuss the
