Mr. Crawford noted budget planning will proceed, due to City Charter requirements. It is unknown at this time, he stated, if the virus response will require additional budget measures. He noted that budget amendments may be necessary later in the year.

Mr. Crawford informed Council and the public that the DDA parking structures are now offering free parking through April 5. There are also bagged meters in front of downtown restaurants to allow for take-out and pick-up, as directed by Governor Whitmer that these businesses close for on-premise gathering. Other meters in the downtown will continue to be enforced.

Mr. Crawford thanked Officer Kellar of the AAPD for his attendance at the meeting this evening.
