Capital Improvements Plan (CIP) Update

 - Other feedback or questions?
- Existing plans and policies: Commission members should be familiar with City plans, to provide feedback about whether CIP project scopes are aligned
 - o Transportation Plan
 - Non-motorized Transportation Plan
 - Notable Existing Transportation Projects, Plans, Policies and Programs (shared at the March 15, 2017 Commission meeting)
