December Events with NAP. City of Ann Arbor Natural Area Preservation (NAP) works to protect and restore Ann Arbor's natural areas and to foster an environmental ethic among its community. This involves conducting plant and animal inventories, ecological monitoring and stewardship projects in Ann Arbor's parks. NAP is releasing its schedule for December. These tasks are performed by both staff and volunteers. For more information about NAP, visit www.a2gov.org/NAP.

Winter Warming Shelter Opening Early to Prevent Spread of COVID-19. This year Winter Warming Shelter programming is starting early to allow for key transitions and additional shelter options for individuals experiencing homelessness, keeping with safety measures to avoid the spread of COVID-19. Winter homeless sheltering efforts began on November 2 as part of a community response.

Due to the need to maintain social distancing, the normal winter capacity of the Delonis Center during has been reduced from 145 beds to 70 currently. To help fill the gap, six congregations have partnered with the Shelter Association to provide rotating overnight shelter (and in some cases daytime shelter), for an entire month each from November through March. Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation Commission has agreed to allow use of Meri Lou Murray Recreational Center for overnight shelter overflow for up to 60 individuals as needed throughout the winter.

Additionally this week, the Shelter Association confirmed receipt of additional funding which will allow them to provide hotel stays for Shelter Association clients who are the most medically fragile. Those hotel stays will also begin on Monday, Nov. 2 at a different area hotel.

The Washtenaw County Health Department will provide ongoing oversight to ensure a healthy environment that maintains social distancing guidelines and screening for COVID-19 prior to entry to either facility. Those exhibiting symptoms are immediately transported to Michigan

Medical for evaluation. CDC cleaning standards will be practiced at all locations and members of the recreation center will continue to retain full access to the facility during regular business hours.
