BACKGROUND: St Thomas' Catholic Church was built in the Romanesque Revival style in 1899. The St. Thomas Rectory was built next door in 1902 in the colonial revival style, with numerous significant architectural features.

LOCATION: The site is located on the east side of Elizabeth Street and the west side of North State Street between High Street and East Kingsley.

APPLICATION: The applicant seeks HDC approval to expand a Memorial Garden located in front of the church along North State Street by installing a granite field stone wall with a 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " limestone cap, L-shaped, that is 33' long parallel to North State and with an approximately 11' return on the north end. The wall varies in height between 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' and around 7'.

APPLICABLE REGULATIONS

From the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation:

(9) New additions, exterior alterations, or related new construction shall not destroy historic materials that characterize the property. The new work shall be differentiated from the old and shall be compatible with the massing, size, scale, and architectural features to protect the historic integrity of the property and its environment.

From the Secretary of the Interior's Guidelines for Rehabilitating Historic Buildings (other SOI Guidelines may also apply):

Setting

Recommended: Retaining the historic relationship between buildings and landscape features of the setting. For example, preserving the relationship between a town common and its adjacent historic houses, municipal buildings, historic roads, and landscape features.

Design Guidelines for Fencing and Walls

Appropriate: Using brick or stone for new walls. Custom masonry products will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

STAFF FINDINGS

- 1. The existing 6' stone wall enclosing the Memorial Garden was built in 1993. This wall would extend the garden to the north along the east elevation of the church. A 12" gap designed between the existing wall and new wall would be infilled with vertical twisted wrought iron bars.
- 2. Staff's biggest concern was whether character-defining features of the east elevation of the church would be obscured by the wall, but this is not the case. There are small basement windows behind the proposed wall but staff doesn't believe obscuring them is problematic, as long as the windows remain in place.
- 3. The work is reversible and does not touch the historic structure. It is similar to the 1993 wall and as such will not be mistaken as historic work.
- 4. Staff recommends approval of the application.

POSSIBLE MOTIONS: (Note that the motion supports staff findings and is only a suggestion. The Review Committee, consisting of staff and at least two Commissioners, will meet with the applicant on site and then make a recommendation at the meeting.)

I move that the Commission issue a certificate of appropriateness for the application at 530 Elizabeth Street, a contributing property in the Old Fourth Ward Historic District, to build a granite field stone wall, as proposed. The work is compatible in exterior design, arrangement, texture, material and relationship to the surrounding resources and meets the *Ann Arbor Historic District Guidelines* for fencing and walls, and *The Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation* and *Guidelines for Rehabilitating Historic Buildings,* in particular standard 9 and the Guidelines for Setting.



PROPOSED WORK:

The proposed work involves the expansion of the existing Memorial Garden at St. Thomas the Apostle Catholic Church. This work includes adding a stone wall, approximately six (6) feet tall, to expand the area of the existing Memorial Garden along North State Street. The wall would be constructed of rough granite field stones, matching those of the existing Memorial Garden stone wall, with matching mortar color and texture, and stone sizes and spacing. A matching limestone cap, with rusticated vertical edges (surfaces) and a smooth top, shall be installed atop the proposed garden wall. The new stone wall shall also match the existing in width, 1'-8" +/- wide.

The top of the new garden wall shall align with the top of the existing Memorial Garden wall. The new wall shall be held away from the existing wall by 12". This will assist in delineating the original garden wall (constructed in 1993) from the proposed garden wall. It will also aid in the construction of the new wall and allow for a visual and aesthetic break. A decorative and open wrought iron panel, with twisted bars is envisioned to fill the gap, while still allowing the visual break.

The stone wall shall be 'L-shaped', with the eastern wall being 32' in length, and the north leg of the wall being 11' in length, and stopping short of the church by 6'-3". This will allow for access to the Memorial Garden from the State Street entrance to the church. The existing Memorial Garden gate shall be relocated at this new north entrance to the Memorial Garden, as noted on the accompanying preliminary drawings.

The new garden space is designed to have a perimeter stone path with a large central garden area inside. The new stone walkways shall match the existing garden, reusing the stone that is currently along the east side of the church. This inner garden area is shown as preliminary in nature and is subject to redesign, based upon review and design feedback by the Church's Cemetery Committee. The interior layout of the garden space and pathways is therefore not shown in it's final configuration.

DESCRIBE CONDITIONS THAT JUSTIFY THE PROPOSED CHANGES:

St. Thomas the Apostle Catholic Church constructed a Memorial Garden in 1993, when the restoration/renovation and addition to the original church commenced. Since that time the Memorial Garden has been used to pay tribute to, and to pray for, departed loved ones. It is a setting in which cremains of those who have died are interred and perpetually cared for and looked after.

The original Memorial Garden was in need of additional garden space to provide areas for current and future interments, which led to plans for expanding the existing Memorial Garden. The additional garden walls help to provide a calm and peaceful enclosure for prayer, meditation, and remembrance.

The changes noted above, in the proposed work, do not connect to the existing church, and are only an extension of the existing garden walls and Memorial Garden.



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

ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE CATHOLIC CHURCH: MEMORIAL GARDEN ADDITION:

PROJECT SCOPE:

There is a need for additional Memorial Garden space, and the proposed project shows how the Memorial Garden can be expanded.


The following slides show the expansion to be north of the existing Memorial Garden. The expansion will include a granite stone wall with limestone cap. The stone and stone cap shall match the existing stone wall construction in materials and construction.

The top of the new garden wall shall align with the top of the existing garden wall. The new wall shall be held away from the existing wall by 12". This will help in delineating the original garden wall (constructed in 1993) from the proposed wall. It will also aid in the construction of the new wall and allow for a visual and aesthetic break. A decorative and open wrought iron panel, with twisted bars is envisioned to fill the gap, while still allowing the visual break.

The stone wall shall be 'L-shaped', with the north leg of the wall stopping short of the church. This will allow for access to the Memorial Garden from the State Street entrance to the church. The existing Memorial Garden gate shall be relocated at this north entrance, as noted on the preliminary drawings.


The new garden space is designed to have a perimeter stone path with a large central garden area inside. The new stone walkways shall match the existing garden, reusing the stone that is currently along the east side of the church. 
The following drawings are for review and comment. More detailed drawings and specifications shall be developed once the final design drawings have been approved.




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







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
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





1993: CONSTRUCTION OF THE CHURCH ADDITION AND OF THE NEW MEMORIAL GARDEN








