Mayor Hieftje called the meeting of the Ann Arbor City Council to order at 7:07 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom, Jr. Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 301 E. Huron St.

- Thomas Partridge End discrimination in housing and government funding. Give priority to access to affordable housing, transportation, education and health care, not excessive greenbelt funding. (DC-2, DS-11)

Thomas Partridge, Ann Arbor resident, addressed Council regarding ending discrimination in housing and government funding. He urged Council to support affordable housing, transportation and education rather than more Greenbelt funding.

## 2. Kermit Schlansker - Biomass

Kermit Schlansker, 2960 Marshall, addressed Council regarding biomass. He said that biomass is poor people's fuel and can be germinated, graphed, planted and harvested locally, without the aid of Washington. He stated biomass heats in the winter and small biomass plants can be used to make power when solar and wind power fail. He encouraged local government to do more to support biomass efforts.

# 3. Matthew Grocoff - Pedestrian Ordinance (C-1)

Matthew Grocoff, 217 S. Seventh St., spoke in support of the proposed Pedestrian Ordinance changes. He said that it is not just about bicyclists, bikes, drivers, cars and pedestrians, but it's about valuing people in the community.

# 4. Joel Batterman - Pedestrian Ordinance (C-1)

Joel Batterman, 1512 Gilbert Ct., vice chair of the Washtenaw Bicycling and Walking Coalition, addressed Council regarding the proposed Pedestrian Ordinance changes. He urged Council to take positive action for better crosswalk engineering, enforcement and education for the health and well being of all members of the community.

# 5. Thomas Collet - Pedestrian Ordinance (C-1)

Thomas Collet, 405 Awixa Rd., addressed Council regarding the proposed Pedestrian Ordinance. He encouraged Council to make sure that the actual problems are addressed, which include driving too fast, tailgating and texting while driving. Getting to the root of the problem is better than repealing or rolling back the existing pedestrian ordinance.

# 6. Isaac Gilman - Pedestrian Ordinance (C-1)

Isaac Gilman, 1760 Broadway St., an Urban Planning student, said that he did not feel safe crossing Plymouth Road near the Islamic Center and the shopping center where Kroger's is located. Mr. Gilman stated he did not feel safe standing on a small concrete island while cars move by him as he tries to cross the street. He added that the ordinance is a great plan to alleviate the stress of crossing larger busy streets and encouraged the Council to adopt crosswalk design guidelines.

# 7. Erica Briggs - Pedestrian Ordinance (C-1)

Erica Briggs, 719 W. Jefferson, spoke in support of the proposed Pedestrian Ordinance changes and urged Council not to repeal the entire ordinance. She said that the proposed language would help strengthen and clarify the ordinance. She updated Council with regards to the outreach program and their crosswalk observations at different crosswalks around Ann Arbor.

# 8. Kathy Griswold - Pedestrian Ordinance (C-1)

Kathy Griswold, 3565 Foxhunt Dr., spoke in opposition to the proposed Pedestrian Ordinance. She said that it is not the optimal action for improving pedestrian safety and it introduces confusion, conflict and an unacceptable level of risk. The proposed changes are not progressive, she stated.

## 9. Larry Deck - Pedestrian Ordinance (C-1)

Larry Deck, 3050 Lorraine, member of the Washtenaw Bicycling and Walking Coalition, said that Council is making good progress on improving the Pedestrian Ordinance, but there is still room for more improvement. An inclusive process is needed to help identify the problems and develop solutions that would work over the long term, he stated.

## 10. Henry Herskovitz - Challenging Israel's Legitimacy

Henry Herskovitz, 404 Mark Hannah Pl., addressed Council regarding challenging Israel's legitimacy.

## COUNCILMEMBER DEREZINSKI

Councilmember Derezinski said that the R4C and R2A study committee had its final meeting on November 9, 2011. The report that Council requested would be made available to Council soon.

## COUNCILMEMBER TAYLOR

Councilmember Taylor said that constituents have spoken to him regarding commercial handbills and undesired newspapers being delivered to their homes and left in the driveways. Councilmember Taylor stated that he and Councilmember Hohnke are working on an ordinance change that would increase the ability of residents to maintain their homes as they wish and to prevent the unwanted distribution of commercial handbills and newspapers.

#### **COUNCILMEMBER ANGLIN**

Councilmember Anglin said that a meeting has been scheduled for November 11, 2011 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the former site of the Fox Tent and Awning Company. Fox Tent left the community and the property was sold. A development project has been planned for the site and residents of that area are invited to attend a meeting to have an opportunity to speak with the developers and review ideas that the developers have for the site.

#### COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere reported that the Medical Marijuana Licensing Board has met three times so far and they are planning to meet again on November 30, 2011 and again sometime in December. The Board was mandated to provide a report to Council in January and they are working towards meeting that deadline. She said that applications have not been evaluated by the board and they are still working on policies and recommendations to clarify details that were missed in the ordinance.

#### MAYOR HIEFTJE

Mayor Hieftje said that Congressman John Dingell would be attending the Stadium Bridges construction project ground-breaking event scheduled for 10 a.m. on November 21, 2011.

Thomas Partridge, City resident, expressed concern with the proposed site plan.

Chris Crockett, Old Fourth Ward Neighborhood, said that the proposed site plan is an appropriate development for the site. It is in the D1 District, she said. There are some concerns that have not received a good response from the developers and architects. Ms. Crockett stated that she would still like to see these issues resolved.

Ethel Potts, 1014 Elder Blvd., said this is the first test of the new downtown planning process. She expressed concern with the site plan, stating that it is not compatible

with surrounding properties.

Steve Kaplan, 418 E. Washington, said that he was excited to have this in the neighborhood and was impressed with the intentions of the developer.

Brad Moore, representing the project design team, explained the project to Council and was available to answer questions of Council.

Bob Cane, member of the design team, said that the developers took into consideration a lot of the commentary that was brought up regarding the project during community meetings and he stated that design issues have been addressed regarding the building facing Huron Street, which helps the scale and character of the street.

John Floyd, treasurer of the church next door to the project, spoke in opposition to the proposed site plan, stating that the building is not compatible with surrounding properties in the area.

Tom Hayward, president of the State Street Area neighborhood association, spoke in support of the proposed development and asked that Council confirm Planning Commission's vote on the project. He added that it is the future of downtown to have higher density.

Ray Detter, representing the Downtown Citizens Advisory Council, spoke in support of the proposed development and said that improvements have been made to the site.

There being no further comment, the Mayor declared the hearing closed.
