#### WATER SUPPLY

The City's water supply is expected to improve due to the rain fall today and the expected rain fall tomorrow. The water level should reach normal levels for this time of year. The City has had enough drinking water to meet current demands, even with the dry weather.

#### BETTER BUILDINGS FOR MICHIGAN PROGRAM

Staff is working with the Better Buildings for Michigan Program, which offers incentives and rebates for energy improvements. The program has been expanded to include all of Washtenaw County. There are significant energy and improvement incentives available for residents, including double the rebates offered by DTE.
