1. Thomas Partridge - Expansion of integrated human services needed, including affordable housing, health care and transportation; not drug dispensaries. Re-Elect President Obama. (C-1, DS-8, I-4)

Thomas Partridge, Ann Arbor resident, addressed Council regarding the need for expanding integrated human services, including affordable housing, health care and transportation. He spoke in opposition to medical marijuana drug dispensaries and encouraged Council and the public to re-elect President Obama.

# 2. Kermit Schlansker - Global Warming

Kermit Schlansker, City resident, addressed Council regarding global warming and its impacts on the community. He expressed concern with what appeared to be a lack of interest in global warming by Council.

#### 3. Valerie Strassberg - Green Street Initiative (I-3)

Valerie Strassberg, chair of the Green Street Initiative, addressed Council regarding this Initiative. Ms. Strassberg stated the Green Street initiative would allow City Staff to look at and review green streets in a formal process. The initiative looks at designing and reconstructing roads and what can be done to integrate green structures, including planting vegetation, curb-outs, etc. She hoped that Council would consider approving a resolution that the Environmental Commission recently considered at their meeting. A copy of that resolution is on file in the City Clerk's Office.

Councilmember Briere asked for an update regarding Camp Take Notice.

Mayor Hieftje responded that the non-profits in the community are working with the people who may be displaced at Camp Take Notice. He stated efforts are being made to provide housing vouchers and the Delonis Center is also helping with the transition efforts.

Councilmember Hohnke placed a nomination on the table of Archer Christian to the Greenbelt Advisor Commission. The nomination, replacing long-serving member Mike Garfield, would be coming back to Council on July 2 for a vote. Councilmember Hohnke publicly thanked Commissioner Garfield for his many years of dedicated service to the Greenbelt Advisory Commission.

Mayor Hieftje also recognized the work of Mr. Garfield on the Commission. He also responded to comments made by Mr. Schlansker earlier in the meeting. Mayor Hieftje stated that the City has been one of the leading cities in the country in energy conservation and hoped that Mr. Schlansker would return to hear more about the City's environmental efforts in the coming months.
