City Council

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Hieftje called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom, Jr. Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 301 E. Huron St.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

Council stood for a moment of silence.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Hieftje led Council in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

1. Thomas Partridge - Empower the disenfranchised residents of Michigan. Give a voice to unions, to the disabled and to seniors. Fund and enact affordable transportation and housing. Recall Ann Arbor Mayor Hieftje and Governor Snyder.

Thomas Partridge, Ann Arbor resident, addressed Council regarding empowering the disenfranchised residents of Michigan; giving a voice to unions, to the disabled and to seniors; funding and enacting affordable transportation and housing; and the recall of Ann Arbor Mayor Hieftje and Governor Snyder.

2. Henry Herskovitz - Response to Communications from Council

Henry Herskovitz, City resident, responded to comments made by Councilmember Warpehoski regarding the protest of synagogues by pro-Palestinian demonstrators. He objected to Councilmember Warpehoski's criticisms, stating that the demonstrations are peaceful.

3. Blaine Coleman - Boycott Israel

Blaine Coleman, City resident, urged Councilmember Warpehoski to retract his comments regarding the protests and divestment from Israel.

4. Kermit Schlansker - A Show Place

Kermit Schlansker, City resident, urged Council to consider alternative energy sources.

5. Mozhgan Savabieasfahani - Boycott Israel

Mozhgan Savabieasfahani, City resident, urged Council and the public to boycott Israel.

6. Alan Haber - Library Lot - Experiments and Development

Alan Haber, City resident, provided Council with a list of ideas for the redevelopment of the library lot. He urged Council to consider the public's opinion and to use the spot for open space.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere expressed concern with public speakers and other members of the community singling out individual members of Council with matters that are not Council business. She stated with regard to Palestine and the divestment from Israel, the City of Ann Arbor does not send money to Israel and this is not a local issue.

COUNCILMEMBER HIGGINS

Councilmember Higgins updated Council on the Budget Committee. She stated they have begun working on the budget reviews and the first budget Working Session would be February 11 at 6:00 p.m. She stated the February 11 Work Session will include updates from Affordable Housing, 15th District Court and then the proposed CIP budget. Councilmember Higgins stated Monday, February 25 will also be a budget Work Session, focusing on departmental budget impact sheets and Council priorities. The 2nd and 4th Mondays in March are also reserved for budget working sessions and all sessions will begin at 6:00 p.m.

COUNCILMEMBER KUNSELMAN

Councilmember Kunselman updated Council on his plans to bring forward amendments to the DDA ordinance. He expressed concern with the current TIF annual report provided by the DDA.

Councilmember Kunselman stated that he believes Council should sell the old YMCA lot. He stated he will be presenting Council with a resolution to sell the property, noting that he did not feel like the Connecting William Street project provided a viable solution. Councilmember Kunselman, as chair of the Ann Arbor Taxicab Board, addressed the recent sexual assault that took place in an illegally operating taxi. He stated he has expressed concern over the years with the illegal operation in the City of limousine or rogue taxi services. He would like the ordinance amended to allow the Police to ticket these operations. Councilmember Kunselman stated the City should not have to wait for State law changes.

MAYOR HIEFTJE

Mayor Hieftje noted that he received a report from Ellen Schulmeister of the Shelter Association. She informed him that no one seeking shelter has been turned away and accommodations have been made for those under the influence of drugs or alcohol as well.

COUNCILMEMBER TAYLOR

Councilmember Taylor informed Council that the Burns Park Players latest production is at Tappan Middle School and performances continue through this weekend.

Claudia J. Masic, manager of Forest Hills Cooperative, spoke in opposition to the proposed rezoning.

Thomas Partridge, City resident, spoke about the need for more affordable housing in the City.

There being no further comment, the Mayor declared the hearing closed.
