Mayor Hieftje called the meeting to order at 7:12 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom, Jr. Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 301 E. Huron St.

Thomas Partridge, Ann Arbor resident, addressed Council regarding improving

access to human rights, disability rights, and affordable housing.; reforming tax, planning and zoning policies. He also requested the resignation of irresponsible political officials.

2. Peter Eckstein - New Grad Student Dorm

Peter Eckstein, 2551 Londonderry, expressed concern with the proposed new grad student dorm and the over-saturation of the market with this type of housing. He said that the problems with the zoning review suggest the City's own review of the ordinances may not be enough and a moratorium should be considered to allow time to study the issue.

3. Norman Hyman - Zoning Ordinance and Site Plan Requirements

Norman Hyman, 300 E. Long Lake Road in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan, addressed Council regarding the City's zoning ordinance and site plan requirements. He said that Council must comply with the entire ordinance. If the developer does not meet all of the standards in the City's codes, the plan must be denied.

4. Henry Herskovitz - Israel Attacks Christians on Easter

Henry Herskovitz, Ann Arbor resident, addressed Council regarding Israeli attacks on Christians on Easter Sunday.

5. Christine Brummer - Zoning and Design Review

Christine Brummer, Ann Arbor resident, addressed Council regarding the A2D2 process and site plan reviews.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

Councilmember Warpehoski informed Council and the public that the Washtenaw Area Transportation Study (W.A.T.S.) is reviewing their 2040 Transportation Plan. The plan addresses investments that the County should be considering regarding roads, pedestrian infrastructure, non-motorized paths, etc. Councilmember Warpehoski urged the public to review the plan now. He stated that W.A.T.S. is taking feedback until May 15, 2013. The plan can be found at www.MIWATS.org.

COUNCILMEMBER KUNSELMAN

Councilmember Kunselman responded to public comments on the DDA ordinance regarding the needs of the homeless and disadvantaged populations, including recovering addicts. Councilmember Kunselman stated that he would be proposing ordinance amendments that would allocate 10 percent of the TIF capture to the DDA Housing Fund. The DDA Housing Fund would only serve those at 30 percent of the median family income or to the standards of the Ann Arbor Housing Commission. Fifty percent of the TIF rebate, if using the existing TIF methodology, would go straight to the City's Affordable Housing Trust Fund.

COUNCILMEMBER ANGLIN

Councilmember Anglin spoke about a Fifth Ward project on Glendale Street. He thanked staff and the City Administrator for allowing City staff to speak directly with the public and to collaborate and work together to meet everyone's needs on this project. He said the meetings held on this project are a good model for future development projects in the City.

MAYOR HIEFTJE

Mayor Hieftje announced that he and Councilmember Briere attended the meeting of the Washtenaw Metro Alliance. The meeting was attended by Police and Fire Chiefs from the City of Ann Arbor, the City of Ypsilanti, Scio Township, Ann Arbor Township, Pittsfield Township, Superior Township and Ypsilanti Township. The group had a discussion about creating a better coordinated response and mutual aid system for fire, moving beyond the current box alarm process in place. A great deal of progress has been made, he said. There are now five communities participating in the coordinated response. They are Ann Arbor City, Ypsilanti City, Ypsilanti, Pittsfield and Superior Townships.

Councilmember Briere spoke about the information she learned regarding fire dispatch, response and mutual aid. She stated that currently the first due firefighters arrive at a scene and determine whether they need another fire engine in the City to respond or whether to call in a "box alarm" that triggers the dispatch of firefighters from other jurisdictions to respond. What's being proposed now is the Mutual Aid Box Alarm System to be implemented instead. The Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (when there is a fire alarm) triggers the entire group of firefighters with the initial dispatch. First on the scene then determines whether it is a serious fire that needs additional assistance or whether the other engines can be cancelled. The goal is to have more firefighters on scene in the first five minutes when needed.

The Board deals with community corrections, Police Department issues, parole, etc. and they do need people to sit on the board by statute in order to fulfill a requirement for a grant that they apply for every year. The meetings are infrequent, meeting at 4:00 p.m. in the afternoon. He said that it's a board that people may find interesting to serve on.
