CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Taylor called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom, Jr. Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 301 E. Huron St.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

Council stood for a moment of silence.

AC COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

City Administrator Steve Powers updated City Council on the recent snow storm stating that the Ann Arbor area received about 14 inches of snow in 28 hours, which was reported as the 3rd largest event since 1970. Mr. Powers stated that as of this afternoon, all major roads had been plowed at least twice. Local streets are managed in 22 sections and as of this afternoon, 7 sections had been completed. Crews are working 12-hour shifts, 24 hours a day. It is expected that all local streets will be plowed by 1pm Tuesday. Once all local streets have been cleared, crews will begin work in the downtown area to clear alleys and parking lanes. Mr. Powers noted that the City has information available on its website, including an FAQ page.

Chief John Seto of the Ann Arbor Police Department updated Council on the investigation by the Michigan State Police regarding the officer involved shooting of Aura Rosser. He stated the County Prosecutor does not plan to file charges against the officer.
