1. Alissa Beveridge - Geddes Ave. Improvement Project (DS-2)

Alissa Beveridge, 2651 Geddes, expressed concerns about the scope of the Geddes Avenue improvement project. She stated more work is needed to engage citizens in the process and urged Council to listen to neighbor concerns.

Kermit Schlansker, Saline resident, spoke about the need for energy improvements and alternative energy sources in order to save the planet.

4. Bob Galardi - Budget

Bob Galardi, Chair of the Allen Creek Greenway Conservancy, spoke in support of funding for a greenway master plan in the FY2016 budget.

A public hearing was conducted on the proposed Resolution Authorizing the City Administrator to Proceed Toward Implementation of Recommended Best Practices to Receive Redevelopment Ready Communities Certification. Notice of public hearing was published April 13, 2015.

The following people were present to speak at the hearing:

Mark Gerstein, 1321 Forest Ave, spoke in opposition to the Redevelopment Ready Community Certification change that would take away certain development project approvals from City Council. He urged Council to reconsider.

An unknown member of the public questioned how this resolution was ever considered on the Consent Agenda. He stated this program is designed for poor communities.

Ed Vielmetti, of Brooklyn Street in lower Burns Park, spoke in opposition. He stated the City's development process needs to involve the public at the Council level.

Ethel Potts, 1014 Elder, spoke in opposition. She concurred with other speakers that the program is designed for economically challenged communities.

James D'Amour, former Planning Commissioner, spoke in opposition, stating local elected officials need to review and approve development projects, not staff.

Kathy Boris, 1726 Charlton, stated Ann Arbor does not need the Redevelopment Ready certification. She questioned who authorized proposing this resolution as a Consent Agenda item.

Jeff Hayner, Pontiac Trail, urged Council to vote no on this resolution, stating this is not needed in Ann Arbor.

Rita Mitchell, 621 Fifth Street, spoke in opposition.

An unknown resident spoke in opposition.

Eleanor Linn, 1321 Forest, spoke in opposition to the proposed resolution.

An unknown resident spoke in opposition, stating the citizen boards and commission do not always reflect the current voice of the community when their appointments have been made over many years by one Mayor.

Kathy Griswold, 3565 Fox Hunt, spoke in opposition, stating this program is a solution in search of a problem and is not needed in Ann Arbor.

Chris Crockett, Old Fourth Ward, spoke in opposition, asking what the problem is that needs to be solved.

Sally Petersen, 2nd Ward resident, spoke in support and stated there is a need in Ann Arbor.

Julie Ritter, 920 Catherine, stated Ann Arbor is already "redevelopment ready" and this program is not necessary.

Ray Detter, downtown resident, spoke in opposition.

Don Salberg, Northeast Ann Arbor resident, spoke in opposition, stating the MEDC is insulting the City Council.
