#### 1. Jeff Hayner - Open Discussion with DDA for Modification of the City/DDA Parking Agreement (DC-1)

Jeff Hayner, 1807 Pontiac Trail, expressed concern about the proposed modifications to the City/DDA Parking agreement. He also spoke in opposition to DC-3, the Resolution of Intent on the Use and Administration of the Street, Bridge, and Sidewalk Millage Funds.

# 2. Kathy Griswold - Construction Contract to P. K. Contracting, Inc. for Pavement Marking Maintenance (CA-12)

Kathy Griswold, 3565 Fox Hunt, spoke about CA-12, a construction contract with P.K. Contracting for Pavement Marking Maintenance, expressing concern about the lack of best practices with pavement marking.

#### 3. Henry Herskovitz - Holocaust Comments

Henry Herskovitz, 404 Mark Hannah, addressed his previous comments regarding the Holocaust and Council Member Ackerman's reaction to his comments.

#### 4. Lefiest Galimore - Youth Employment

Lefiest Galimore, 3139 Plymouth, spoke about the importance of community engagement and the need to empower young people.

#### 5. Nirmala Hanke - Safety in Parks

Nirmala Hanke, 2263 Manchester, spoke about safety concerns in the City parks during the recently concluded deer cull.

#### 6. Sabra Sanzotta - Budget

Sabra Sanzotta, 3087 Glazier Way, spoke about the City's budget and the use of taxpayer funds to appease a special interest group, stating the deer cull was not supported by the community, but only a minority of vocal residents involved in the WC4EB, Washtenaw Citizens For Ecological Balance.

#### 7. David Silkworth - Deer Management Program

David Silkworth, 2048 Charlton, spoke about the special interest group, WC4EB, and Councilmember Lumm's close connection to the group during the City's deer cull discussions.

#### 8. Jennifer Robertson - New City Administrator

Jennifer Robertson, 1310 Glendaloch, spoke about corruption and cronyism.

#### CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

#### COUNCILMEMBER KRAPOHL

Councilmember Krapohl updated Council and the public regarding his medical treatment and health. He thanked everyone for their support and stated he is able to continue to serve the public.

#### COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

Councilmember Warpehoski addressed the recent hate speech that was chalked on the University of Michigan campus. He thanked the community members who came together in support of the Muslim community and promoted peace and inclusiveness.

# COUNCILMEMBERS WARPEHOSKI, EATON, KAILASAPATHY, GRAND, WESTPHAL AND MAYOR TAYLOR

Councilmembers addressed public comments regarding Councilmember Lumm's relationship with the pro-deer cull group, WC4EB, stating that constituent outreach and working directly with residents is not unethical or cronyism. Members stated Councilmember Lumm is very responsive to her constituents. Councilmember Westphal encouraged all involved in the conversation to remain respectful of each other and of dissenting opinions.

#### COUNCILMEMBER GRAND

Councilmember Grand spoke about the Sheriff's youth engagement program and stated she is in touch with staff to make this happen. Councilmember Grand also stated there is a community meeting on June 30 for the Southeast Area. The meeting will take place at Scarlett Middle School.

#### COUNCILMEMBER ACKERMAN

Councilmember Ackerman reminded the public that there is a public Meet and Greet of the new City Administrator candidates on Thursday, April 14. The Meet and Greet is open to the public and will be held in the Justice Center Lobby from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. He encouraged all to attend.

Councilmember Lumm thanked her colleagues for their support and kind words.
