City Council will meet in caucus the Sunday prior to each regular session at 3:30 p.m. in Council Chambers.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Taylor called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom, Jr. Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 301 E. Huron Street.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

Council stood for a moment of silence.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Taylor led Council in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

AC COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

City Administrator Howard Lazarus thanked the community and City staff for the warm welcome, stating he is looking forward to getting to know the City.

Mr. Lazarus reported on the following items:

Termination of ReCommunity Contract

Today the City terminated the contract with ReCommunity, the operator of the City's Material Recovery Facility and Transfer Station. The termination is effective Monday July 11, 2016. The City's decision to terminate this contract was based on ongoing and repeated safety deficiencies in ReCommunity's operations of the facilities, including several fires since the beginning of the year and operating practices that jeopardized employee safety.

Effective Monday, July 11, the City will implement temporary procedures to continue

the collection of trash and recyclables. It's expected that these temporary procedures will be in place for approximately one month. During this time, collection of trash and recyclables will continue to occur on their normally scheduled days of the week. However, service may occur at a different time of the day than has been the practice.

In the meantime, an interim operator will be identified to restore operations.

If residents have questions or believe their pickup has been missed, please contact the customer service department at 794-6000 or utilize A2FixIt.

The City thanks residents and businesses in advance for their understanding of this decision and their patience as the City works through this transition.

Argo Cascades

The City has temporarily ceased river trips due to continuing drops in the water level. One stop log has been put in place to reduce the flow to the Argo Cascades, and another will be placed at the entrance to the Cascades tomorrow if no rain is received this evening. If that happens, we will most likely need to block the entrance to the Cascades due to the drop these actions will create, however tube users will be able to access the Cascades after the first drop. If it does not rain, we may need to put a stop plate in and close the Cascades on Monday. The City will continue to keep the public informed as to the status of the Cascades as restrictions are put in place.

Nancy Schewe, President of the Ann Arbor League of Women Voters, spoke in support of two local election reform items, DC-3 and DC-4. Ms. Schewe expressed support for non-partisan elections and an increase from two-year to four-year terms for

Mayor and Council.

2. Jerry Partovich - ADU Ordinance (C-2)

Jerry Partovich, 1515 Ridge Road, Superior Township, spoke in support for the proposed Accessory Dwelling Unit Ordinance, stating it is mutually beneficial for neighborhoods and those in need of affordable housing.

3. Frank Simmons - ADU Ordinance (C-2)

Frank Simmons, 41 Carrot Way, spoke in support of the proposed Accessory Dwelling Unit Ordinance.

4. Fred J. Beal - Introduction of Kingsley Condos (C-1)

Fred Beal, 2008 Martin, spoke about an upcoming development project and the ordinance to rezone Kingsley Condos (C-1).

5. John Finn - Residential Parking at Argo Cascades

John Finn, 1119 Wright, spoke in support of CA-13, for a residential parking permit program in the neighborhoods surrounding the Argo Cascades. Mr. Finn stated without a parking program, neighborhood streets are overwhelmed by traffic due to the popularity of the Cascades.

6. Blaine Coleman - Boycott Israel

Blaine Coleman, Ann Arbor resident, urged Council to boycott Israel.

7. Mozghan Savabiessahani - Boycott Israel

Mozghan Savabiessahani, City resident, spoke about Israel and encouraged a boycott.

8. Lorraine Shapiro - New City Staff

Lorraine Shapiro, 1484 Green, welcomed the new City Administrator, Mr. Howard Lazarus. She stated she was pleased to see that Mr. Lazarus has spoken about working with all community groups and she hopes to meet with him soon regarding FAAWN and protecting wildlife.

9. Kathy Griswold - Violation of Federal Law

Kathy Griswold, City resident, welcomed the new City Administrator, Mr. Lazarus, and stated she is very happy to see that the City has hired a professional engineer. She thanked Mr. Lazarus for mentioning A2FixIt in his first remarks at City Council. Ms. Griswold also addressed concerns regarding the City's pedestrian signage and compliance with the Uniform Traffic Control Devices manual.

CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER KAILASAPATHY

Councilmember Kailasapathy updated Council and the public on an upcoming meeting regarding the Nixon Road construction plans. The meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, July 13 from 6-8 p.m. at Clague Middle School.

Councilmember Kailasapathy suggested that residents hold back their recycling containers if they are able to store the materials for another week. She suggested if residents can wait until the City has a plan in place, this would help prevent recyclables from ending up in the landfill.

Councilmember Kailasapathy thanked the Wright and Kellogg Street neighbors for working together to find a solution so quickly regarding the Argo Cascades parking and a proposal for a residential parking permit program.

COUNCILMEMBER ACKERMAN

Councilmember Ackerman concurred with Councilmember Kailasapathy and thanked the neighborhoods for their work to implement the residential parking near Argo Cascades.

Councilmember Ackerman stated he will be joining State Representative Jeff Irwin on Friday, July 8 at 5:30 p.m. to conduct an Argo Clean-up. He encouraged anyone who was interested in participating to join them.

COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere spoke about 911 texting, stating she has received inquiries from residents. Councilmember Briere stated the County dispatch does not currently support this technology, but is recognizing the need in the future.

COUNCILMEMBER SMITH

Councilmember Smith stated Vet's Pool is finally open to the public. He thanked staff for their hard work getting the pool back in service and operational in time to celebrate the July 4th holiday, including interim Parks Manager Josh Landefeld.

COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

Councilmember Warpehoski thanked staff as well for the work getting Vet's Pool open for the season. He stated he has learned that over the next five years, the pools and ice rinks will need \$5,000,000 in repairs and work and stated Council needs to start preparing for these capital improvements.

Councilmember Warpehoski spoke about some recent power outages in the Wines neighborhood. He stated DTE is looking for answers.

Councilmember Warpehoski spoke about race relations and the Ann Arbor Police Department. He noted that he recently participated in a ride along program with the AAPD and Chief Baird has offered this program to members of the public.

Councilmember Warpehoski stated he has been approached by several citizens and

members of the Taxicab Board regarding a possible Transportation Commission. Councilmember Warpehoski suggested that perhaps Council vet issues in advance of their priority setting meeting so additional projects could be presented and considered.

Councilmember Westphal reminded the public that Huron River Day is this Sunday, July 10 from 2-4pm with \$5 canoe and kayak rentals.

COUNCILMEMBER GRAND

Councilmember Grand stated she is planning to bring to the July 18 meeting a first reading of a Tobacco 21 ordinance. She stated she is working with the City Attorney's Office and plans to include FAQs with the draft ordinance.

For lots 7,200 square feet or greater in size, the maximum size of an ADU is 800 square feet in gross floor area or the size of the gross floor area of the ground floor of the primary dwelling, whichever is less.
