Whereas, Request 1636 sought records showing the known locations of lead components removed from the City's water system, records showing the known locations of any remaining lead components in the city's water system, and records showing locations where the city believes galvanized water service line may need to be replaced under the revised Lead and Copper Rule;

Whereas, MCL 15.234 permits the City to charge a fee for the cost of search, examination, review, and the deletion and separation of exempt from nonexempt information when fulfilling the request would result in unreasonably high costs to the public body;

Whereas, City Administrative Policy and Procedure 104 defines unreasonably high costs to be a request that entails any one or a combination of: staff time over 1 hour, staff time spent by the IT department performing a search for or retrieval of electronic public records, and staff time spent separating or deleting exempt information from nonexempt information from video recordings, including necessary review;

Whereas, MCL 15.234(8) permits the City to require a good-faith deposit, not to exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ of the total estimated fee, if the fee estimate is larger than \$50.00;

Whereas, APP 104 states the City generally requires a deposit when permitted under the FOIA to preserve public resources;

Whereas, City staff estimated that fulfilling Request 1636 would require 8 hours of staff time to search for the responsive records;

Whereas, The City's definition of "unreasonably high costs" in APP 104 dictates that the first hour of staff time is waived;

Whereas, MCL 15.234 permits the City to charge the hourly wage of the lowest-paid employee capable of performing the work, plus 50% of labor charge amount to cover the cost of fringe benefits;

Whereas, An Applications Specialist was determined to be the lowest-paid employee capable of performing the work;

Whereas, The City estimated that the total fee to fulfill the request would be \$409.71;

Whereas, The City required that the Requestor pay a good-faith deposit of \$204.86 before the City began working to fulfill the request;

Whereas, The City stated that once the Requestor paid the deposit, the City would fulfill the request within 10 business days;

Whereas, MCL 15.234(2) permits a waiver or reduction of the fee, if the public body determines that searching for or furnishing copies of the public record can be considered as primarily benefiting the general public; and]

The proposed amendment included the following language added to the memorandum:

Particulars of the Projects are:

• Net Zero Affordable Housing - The \$200,000.00 will cover the cost of solar, equipment electrification, and any unplanned energy upgrades on the Commission's affordable housing units at Broadway. These units are slated for retrofitting this fiscal year. The Commission is assembling an RFP for a sewer replacement and upgrades (e.g., installing insulation). This already-planned and -approved work presents a perfect opportunity for immediate, additional investments to approach net zero energy.

• Electric Vehicle ("EV") Charging Stations - The \$15,000.00 will allow the purchase of 3 EV charging stations for municipal and public use. As background, City Council approved a resolution to fund the City's first 3 EVs at the October 15th meeting. There is not, however, funding available to install the charging infrastructure. This budget adjustment would remedy that omissions and ensure the City's first 3 EVs may operate

upon delivery.

• RESILIENCE HUBS - \$10,000 SEED FUNDING TO START THE FIRST ANN ARBOR RESILIENCE HUB WHICH WILL HELP FOSTER COMMUNITY SOCIAL COHESION WHILE ALSO PROVIDING RESOURCES FOR THE COMMUNITY IN ADVANCE OF, DURING, AND POST DISASTER. WE ARE ALSO ACTIVELY SEEKING FUNDING TO SUPPORT FULL-SCALE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS PROGRAM.
