COUNCILMEMBER RADINA

Councilmember Radina updated the public on his upcoming Ward 3 coffee hour with Councilmember Grand.

COUNCILMEMBER DISCH

Councilmember Disch reminded the public that a special curbside bulky waste pick-up was happening this week due to the recent storms and resulting floods.

Councilmember Disch also stated a meeting will take place in Ward 1 this Thursday regarding flooding concerns.

COUNCILMEMBER SONG

Councilmember Song reminded residents about the ongoing 21-day equity challenge through United Way and encouraged all to participate.

COUNCILMEMBER NELSON

Councilmember Nelson spoke about the construction project delay for Scio Church Road. She stated the project should resume again after Labor Day.

COUNCILMEMBER EYER

Councilmember Eyer stated she plans to bring a proposed Charter amendment resolution to Council at the next meeting. Councilmember Eyer stated her proposal will amend the procurement process outlined in the City Charter to allow for the implementation of the City's responsible contractor policy.

COUNCILMEMBER RAMLAWI

Councilmember Ramlawi stated he received a number of complaints about the use of fireworks over the holiday weekend.

Councilmember Ramlawi stated he is hoping to have more information soon about the re-opening of Maple Road after the recent watermain break.

COUNCILMEMBER HAYNER

Councilmember Hayner asked for a moment of silence for the passing of former Councilmember Robert Johnson. He noted Mr. Johnson was a leader in environmental issues, including the creation of the Greenbelt.

Councilmember Grand spoke about the ongoing protests at Beth Israel congregation.

Councilmember Griswold thanked the City's administrative assistants for keeping everyone connected during the City Hall closure.

Councilmember Griswold thanked residents who provided video footage of the recent storms and flooding.

Councilmember Griswold stated the Environmental Commission is looking at amendments to the A2Zero plan as a way to better manage storm water.
