Slow Food Huron Valley has applied for a non-competitive special event permit through the Planning and Development Services Unit. The event is for the HomeGrown Festival on Saturday, September 10, 2011 at the Ann Arbor Farmer's Market. The event is taking place on City Parks property and the applicant is requesting a temporary liquor license in order to serve alcohol at the event. Approval by City Council is required in order for the applicant to receive a temporary liquor license from the Michigan Liquor Control Commission. City staff has administratively approved all other requirements for the event and approval of this resolution is recommended.
