Resolution to Approve Lindsay Annexation, 1.96 Acres, 1305 Chalmers and Adjacent Vacant Parcel (CPC Recommendation: Approval - 9 Yeas and 0 Nays).

This resolution is to approve annexation of this property into the City, which is within the City's water and sewer service area and is consistent with the adjacent zoning, land uses and master plan. It will come back for Council action on the zoning change to R1A (Single-Family Dwelling District) after the annexation process is complete. The City Planning Commission, at its meeting of October 16, 2007, recommended approval of the request.

Whereas, The territory hereinafter described is located in the Township of Ann Arbor and is adjacent to the corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor;

Whereas, Robert K. Lindsay Trust is the owner of said property; and

Whereas, It is the desire of Robert K. Lindsay Trust to annex said territory to the City of Ann Arbor, pursuant to the provisions of Act 359 of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan for the year 1947, as amended;

RESOLVED, That the following described lands and premises situated and being in the Township of Ann Arbor, Washtenaw County, Michigan, be detached from said Township of Ann Arbor and annexed to the City of Ann Arbor, to-wit:

Lots 73, 74 and 75, Washtenaw Hills Estates No. 1, a subdivision of part of the southeast quarter of Section 35, Ann Arbor Township, Washtenaw County, Michigan, according to the plat thereof as recorded in Liber 8 of Plats, Page 32, Washtenaw County Records; together with 33 feet of the land abutting the northeast boundary of the above-described land, which is the southwesterly one-half of Stratford Avenue as originally described in the Plat of Washtenaw Hills Estates, but has since been vacated.
