Resolution to Direct the City Administrator to Evaluate the Feasibility for Participation in the AARP Age Friendly Communities Program

The [AARP Network of Age-Friendly Communities <https://www.aarp.org/livable-communities/network-age-friendly-communities/>](https://www.aarp.org/livable-communities/network-age-friendly-communities/) is an affiliate of the 'World Health Organizations Age-Friendly Cities and Communities Program <[http://www.who.int/ageing/age\\_friendly\\_cities\\_network/en/](http://www.who.int/ageing/age_friendly_cities_network/en/)>, an international effort launched in 2006 to help cities prepare for rapid population aging and the parallel trend of urbanization. The program has participating communities in more than 20 nations, as well as 10 affiliates representing more than 1,000 communities. If Ann Arbor joined the program, it would become the fifth Age Friendly Community in the state of Michigan.
